




Mobile-cellular subscriptions, by level of development
















PNGSDP'S WESTERN PROVINCE TOWERS PROJECT (2011)



GESFAIA: to dial a number at random in the hopes of finding a "Phone Friend"

PHONE FRIEND: a partner in phone conversation, almost always of the opposite sex, usually contacted anonymously by random dialling.

SOME CONCLUSIONS [FOR NOW]

INTERPRETING PHONE USE (I)

- THE MOST COMMON USE IS TO KEEP IN TOUCH WITH FAMILY
- THE MOST COMMON WORRY IS THE ISSUE OF "PHONE FRIENDS"

INTERPRETATION: THE "SOCIAL" DIMENSION OF MOBILE PHONE USE IS THE MAIN FOCUS, AND IT IS RECOGNIZED THAT PHONES CAN:

- STRENGTHEN RELATIONS AT A DISTANCE
- THREATEN RELATIONS FROM A DISTANCE


SOME CONCLUSIONS [FOR NOW]

INTERPRETING PHONE USE (II)


- FOR MOST PEOPLE MOBILE PHONES HAVE NOT EXPANDED
 PERSONAL NETWORKS INSTEAD, THEY HAVE
 STRENGTHENED "CORE" NETWORKS (CLOSE FAMILY)
 - TWO SORTS OF USERS, HOWEVER, SEEM TO HAVE USED MOBILES TO BRANCH OUT:
 - THOSE WITH FORMAL EMPLOYMENT
 - THOSE WITH HIGHER EDUCATION




Average Number of Contacts by Employment Status



Age Range X Number of Contacts (All Users)







SOME CONCLUSIONS [FOR NOW]


INTERPRETING PHONE USE (III)

- THOSE WITH FORMAL EMPLOYMENT AND/OR HIGHER EDUCATION MAY BE DIVERSIFYING AND EXPANDING THEIR NETWORKS BEYOND VILLAGE TIES
 - THEY MAY ALSO BE SYSTEMATICALLY "PRUNING" OR "STREAMLINING" THEIR VILLAGE TIES BY USING STRATEGIES FOR CONTROLLING ACCESS
- IF THIS IS SO, THEN MOBILES ARE USED NOT SIMPLY
 TO MAINTAIN SOCIAL RELATIONS, BUT TO GIVE
 INDIVIDUALS GREATER CONTROL OVER THEM INCLUDING
 THE POWER TO LIMIT THE ABILITY OF OTHERS TO CONTACT
 THEM
