




#### How we measured onward migration


- No direct data on onward migration: Government of Canada does not track people that have left Canada
- We use tax data instead: Statistics Canada custom request, based on individual tax filer data
- Last available data: 2020 arrival cohort, filing taxes up to the 2021 tax year
- Onward migrants: PR over 18 years old who landed between 1982 and 2019, filed taxes at least once and failed to do so for two consecutive years and did not file again by 2021

#### Immigrants are leaving at record levels

On average, immigrants who landed since 1982 are leaving at an annual rate of 0.9%




# They are most are risk of leaving in the first 3 to 7 years since arrival




#### Long-term onward migration is accelerating


On average, 18% of immigrants leave within 25 years since arrival, and this percentage is increasing overtime




#### Atlantic Canada has the highest onward migration rates




Atlantic Canada has the highest onward migration rates in the long-term





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
#### Halifax and Moncton though are not the problem




Onward migration is a problem outside of the immigrant attraction centers in Nova Scotia, New Brunswick, as well as Alberta

But the reverse in Quebec, British Columbia and Ontario


#### Onward migration is "brain drain"




Former international students and economic immigrants are leaving



# Francophone immigrants are leaving at a higher rate than anglophones and allophones



About one-third of francophones will leave in the long-term



Quebec and Ontario are disproportionately losing francophone immigrants

### Recommendations and next steps

- Develop early retention strategies: Focus on the first five years after arrival
- Set retention targets: Integrate retention goals into immigration policy
- Support regional policymakers: Address unique retention challenges
- Expand integration services: Especially for francophone immigrants in Quebec and Ontario

### A Scorecard for Immigrant Skill Utilization

**Mapping opportunity by city, nation-wide:** We are developing a scorecard to show how Canadian cities are performing in using immigrant talent effectively.

Focusing on three sectors with urgent needs: Our research examines skill mismatch and skill wastage in health, construction, and accommodation and food services. These sectors have acute labour and skill shortages, yet high availability of immigrant talent.

**Exploring barriers and solutions:** We investigate why and to what extent immigrant skills are underused in key sectors—and what can be done to change that.

**Empowering change-makers:** Our research findings will identify practical steps for government, employers, and settlement services to better align immigrant skills with workforce demands.
