Course requirements

- Colloquium Series in Migration and Ethnic Relations (non-credit requirement, though some departments may allow this to be taken for credit)
- Two half courses in the area, including one from a program other than the student's home program

Thesis or major paper (as specified by student's home program) in the area of Migration and Ethnic Relations

- In the case of a thesis, the thesis advisor and the university examiner must be from faculty associated with the collaborative program
- In the case of a major paper, the advisor must be associated with the collaborative program

PhD

Course requirements

- Colloquium Series in Migration and Ethnic Relations (non-credit requirement, though some departments may allow this to be taken for credit)
- Two half courses in the area, including one from a program other than the student's home program. Following the practice of given programs, courses taken at the Masters level may be credited toward the PhD requirements

Comprehensive Examination in Migration and Ethnic Relations (as specified by student's home program)

Thesis in the area of Migration and Ethnic Relations

- The thesis advisor and the university examiner must be from faculty associated with the collaborative program

These components will serve as partial fulfillment of the requirements for a graduate degree in the home department.
